



2018-19 ACADEMIC YEAR FACTSHEET

Size, Scope, and History

- **# schools:** 224 (2018-19)
- **# schools by grade level:** 94 elementary, 99 middle, 31 high schools (2018-19)
- **# states:** 20 plus the District of Columbia (2018-19)
- **# regions:** 29 (2018-19)
- **# communities:** more than 50 across the country (2018-19)
- **KIPP founded:** 1994. Expanded to South Bronx in 1995.
- **KIPP Foundation formed (and first Fisher Fellow cohort commenced):** 2000
- **First schools founded by Fisher Fellows opened:** 2001

Students

- **# students:** when you need to be exact, use: 96,000 students; when you need to be approximate, use: nearly 100,000 students (2018-19)
- **% African American:** 55% (2017-18)
- **% Latino:** 40% (2017-18)
- **% African American or Latino:** 95% (2017-18)
- **% eligible for federal free and reduced price meals programs:** 89% (2017-18)
- **% who receive special education services:** 11% (2017-18)

- **Student attrition rate:** 13% (fall 2017; the % of students who entered in the fall of 2016 who did not return in the fall of 2017 nor complete the highest grade.)

Teachers

- **# teachers:** nearly 6,000 (projected fall 2018)
- **Average age:** 30 (2017-18)
- **% African American:** 36% (2017-18)
- **% Latino:** 14% (2017-18)
- **% African American or Latino:** 50% of KIPP teachers are African American or Latino (2017-18) compared to [16% of teachers nationally](#) (2015-16)
- **Teacher retention rate:** 65% within role; 73% within school/network (2017-18)

Leaders

- **# leaders trained through KIPP School Leadership Programs since its inception in 2000:** More than 2,100 in the traditional pathways programs *(fall 2018)*
- **% African American:** 28% *(2017-18)*
- **% Latino:** 10% *(2017-18)*
- **% African American or Latino:** 38% of KIPP school leaders are African American or Latino *(2017-18)* compared to [19% of school leaders nationally](#) *(2015-16)*

Student Achievement

- **Elementary School:** By the end of fourth grade, 64% of KIPP classes outperform their local districts in reading and 61% do so in math. *(2016-17)*
- **Middle School:** By the end of eighth grade, 67% of KIPP classes outperform their local districts in reading and 70% do so in math. *(2016-17)*
- **High School (KIPP HS only):** 84% of our KIPP high school classes outperform their local districts in English and 67% do so in math. *(2016-17)*

Alumni and Attainment

- **High school graduation rate:** 92% *(cumulative as of fall 2017; all students who completed a KIPP middle or high school)*
- **College matriculation rate:** 78% *(cumulative as of fall 2017; all students who completed a KIPP middle or high school)*
- **College completion rate:** 41% graduated college: 36% bachelor's degree, 5% associate's degree. For alumni who graduated from KIPP high schools, 45% have completed a bachelor's degree. *(cumulative as of fall 2017; all students who completed a KIPP middle or high school)*
- **# KIPP alumni:** over 27,000 *(projected for fall 2018; alumni include students who have completed either 8th grade or 12th grade at KIPP.)*
- **# KIPP alumni in college:** over 12,000 *(projected for fall 2018)*
- **# KIPP alumni who work for KIPP:** over 200 KIPP alumni are working for KIPP in some role *(projected for fall 2018)*

Impact Beyond KIPP

- **KIPP College Partnerships:** 97 college and university partners are learning alongside KIPP to better support first-generation college goers on the path to a degree *(fall 2018)*
- **Sharing KIPP's approach to leadership development:** KIPP offers development and hands-on training to administrators interested in learning about our principal development model.



23 school districts, charter school systems, and leadership training organizations are part of the 2018-19 KIPP Leadership Design Fellowship (KLDF). 210 non-KIPP leaders have been trained through the program since its inception, representing 71 unique organizations educating more than 10 million students *(fall 2018)*

- **Sharing KIPP Wheatley:** 47 public charter schools beyond KIPP use KIPP’s college-prep literacy curriculum *(fall 2018)*
- **Sharing College Match:** 8 high schools from Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Newark Public Schools, NYC Department of Education, and Aspire Public Schools joined KIPP’s inaugural, year-long college counseling learning collaborative, aimed at improving college access and college outcomes for students *(fall 2018)*
