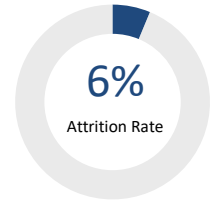

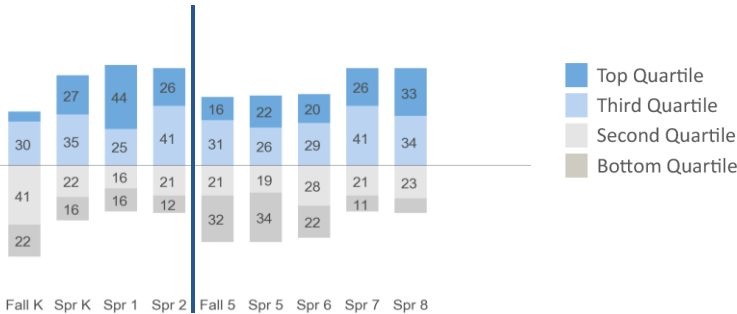

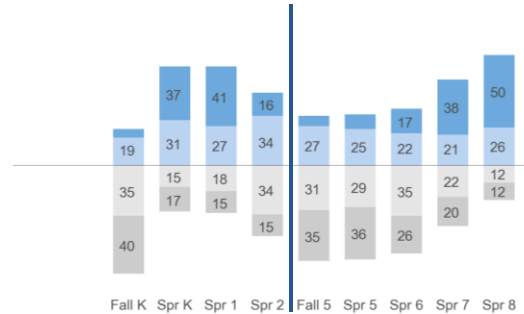
### ARE WE MAKING ENOUGH GROWTH TO REACH GRADE AND COLLEGE-READY LEVELS?

Reading



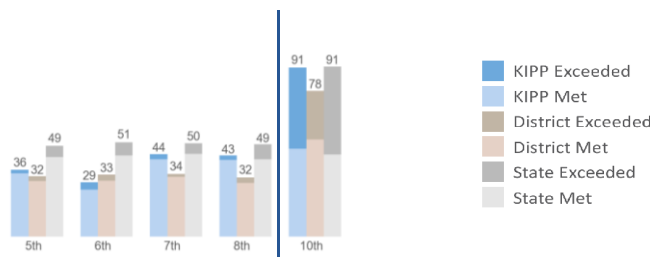

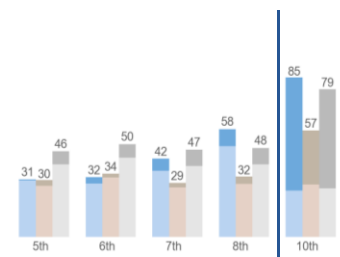
### HOW ARE WE PERFORMING RELATIVE TO OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY?
